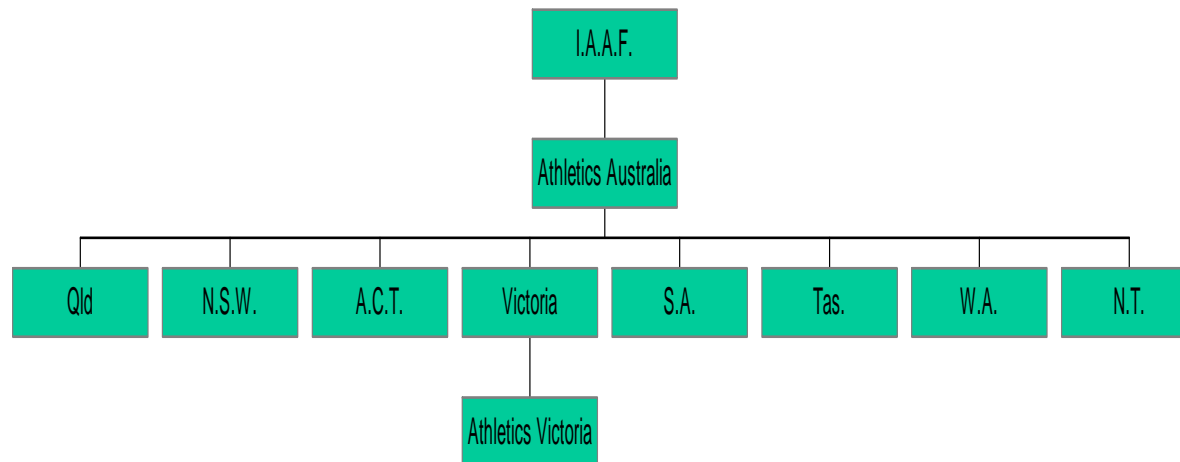

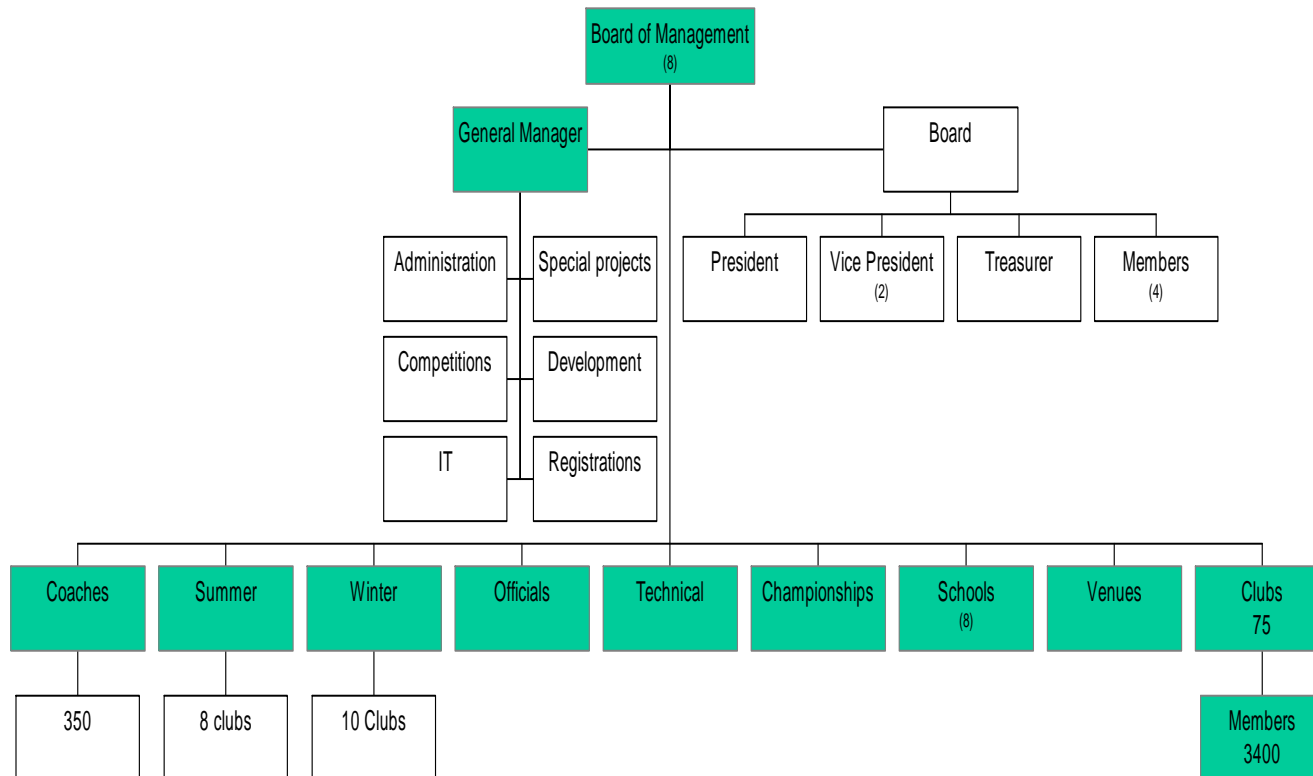

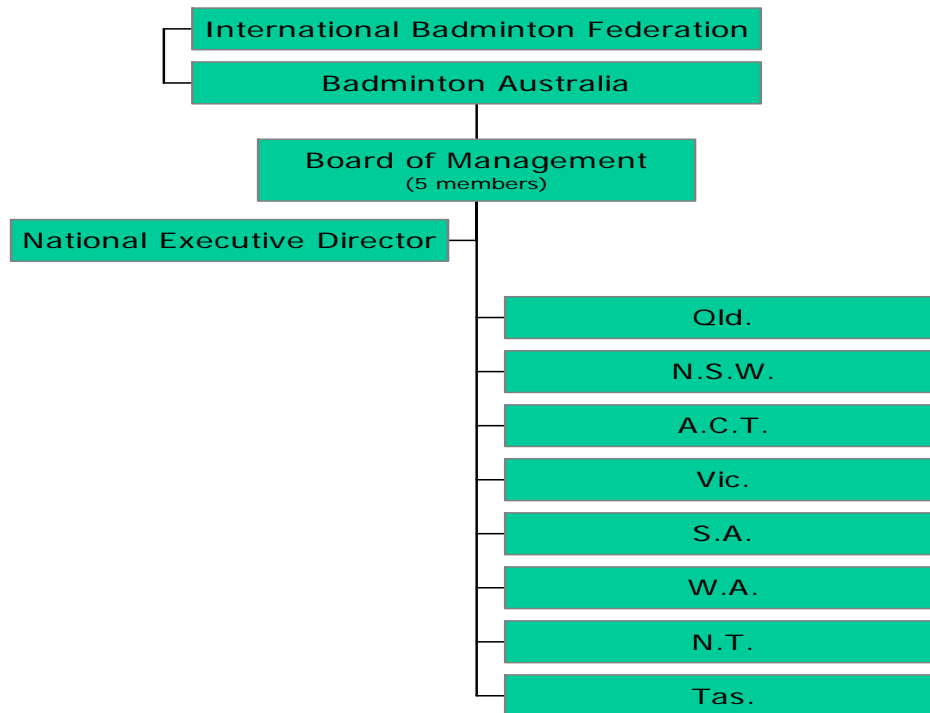

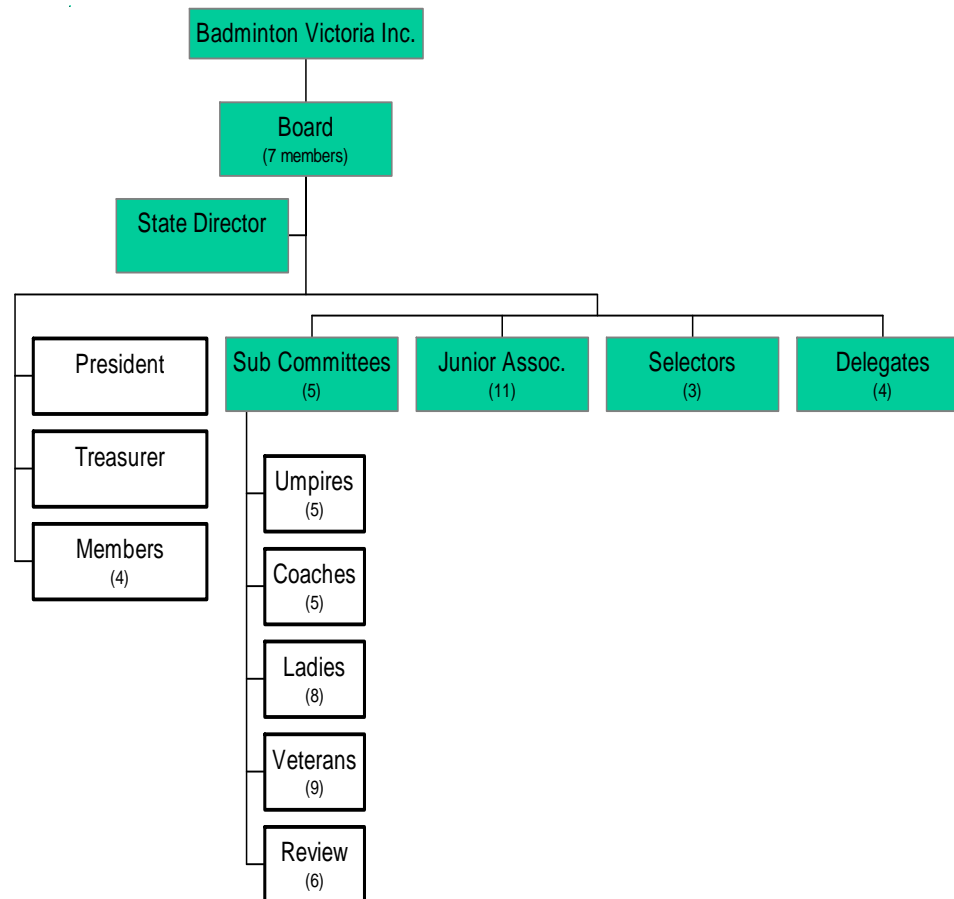

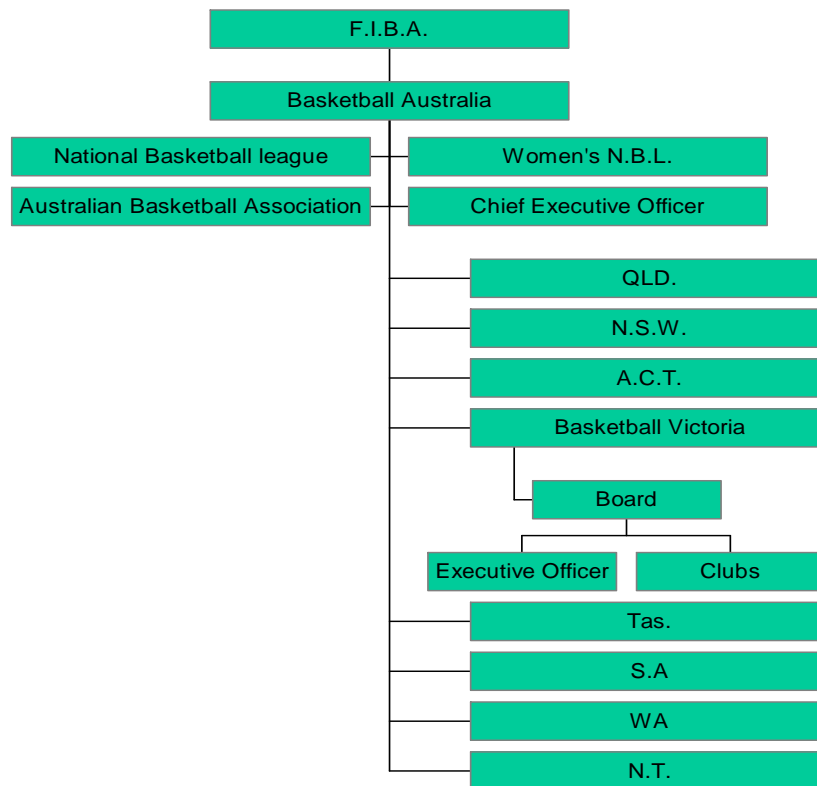
Currently the Constitution is being reviewed and the new one should be in place by March 2001. The major thrust of the new constitution is to do away with individual membership and replace it with associations as the members.

Mapping Structure For Basketball Victoria

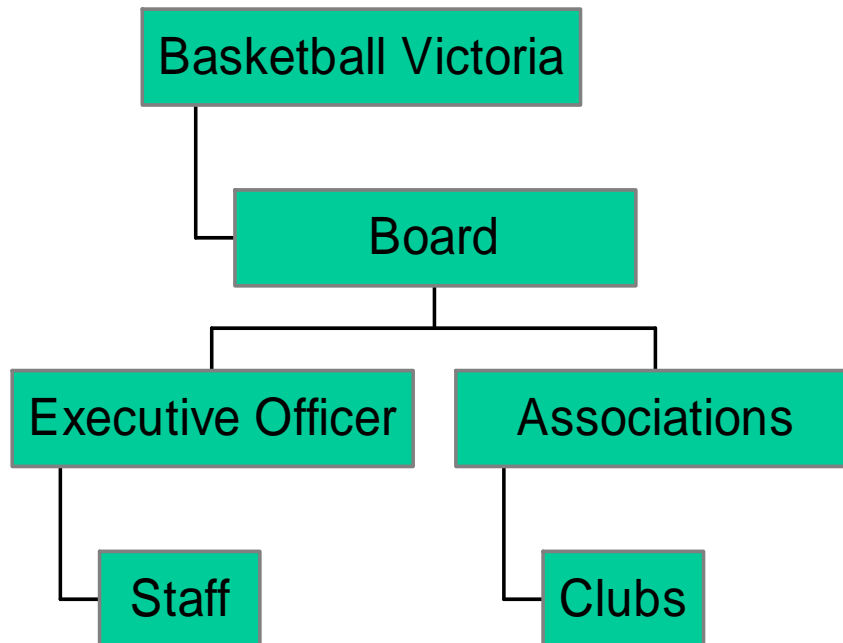
1) National Organisational structure



The NBL, WNBL and ABA are members of BA but run totally autonomous leagues. In recent times, it has been seen as advantageous to get each body to share resources and provide a consistent face to the public through development programs and communication strategies. BA's current strategic review continues to look at these issues. May 2001 is the target for getting each body housed under the one roof.

Victoria has by far the largest number of participants and is seen as the leader in development nationally.

2) State organisational structure



Between the State Executive (Board) and Associations, there are two levels of governance looking after the interests of specific constituents – the Metropolitan Council and the Country Council. Each Council has an elected Committee of Management.

The ultimate decision making body in Victoria is the State Conference where all affiliates are represented. This body meets twice a year, including the AGM.

- i) Basketball Australia are undertaking an extensive review of its governance with the intention that all stakeholders (BA, State, NBL, WNBL and ABA) work together from mid 2001. The implementation of a basketball strategy, national junior development program and the housing of BA, NBL, WNBL and ABA under the one roof are tangible signs that this can be achieved. Once a consistent face is shown to the public, it is expected that strides can again be made in the recruitment of young people to basketball.
 - ii) Recent organisational restructure has meant we now have a Basketball Development Department (on court) as well as an Association Development Department (administrator focused). We are able to ensure associations have the fullest support from BV as they go about the job of recruiting and retaining players. At the end of the day, it is up to the associations to drive recruitment and retention – BV cannot do it for them.

Significant constitutional change this year has brought a new strategic focus on the State Executive leaving operational issues to the brand new Metropolitan Committee of Management.

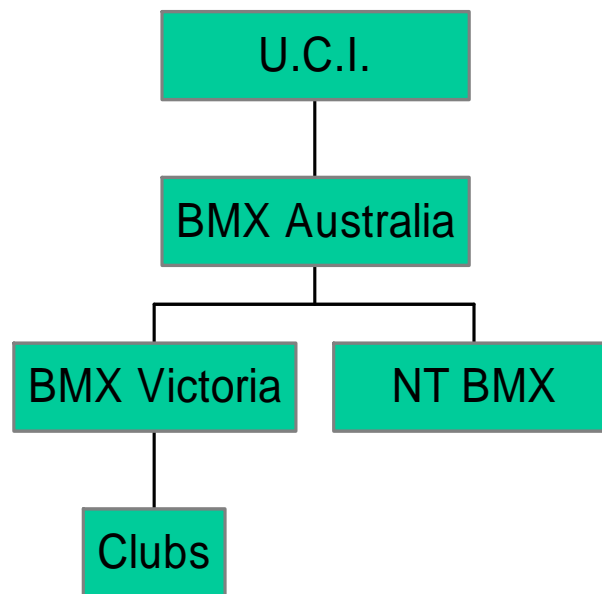
In six months time we will be in a better position to evaluate how this has improved our capacity to make decisions and ensure consultation.

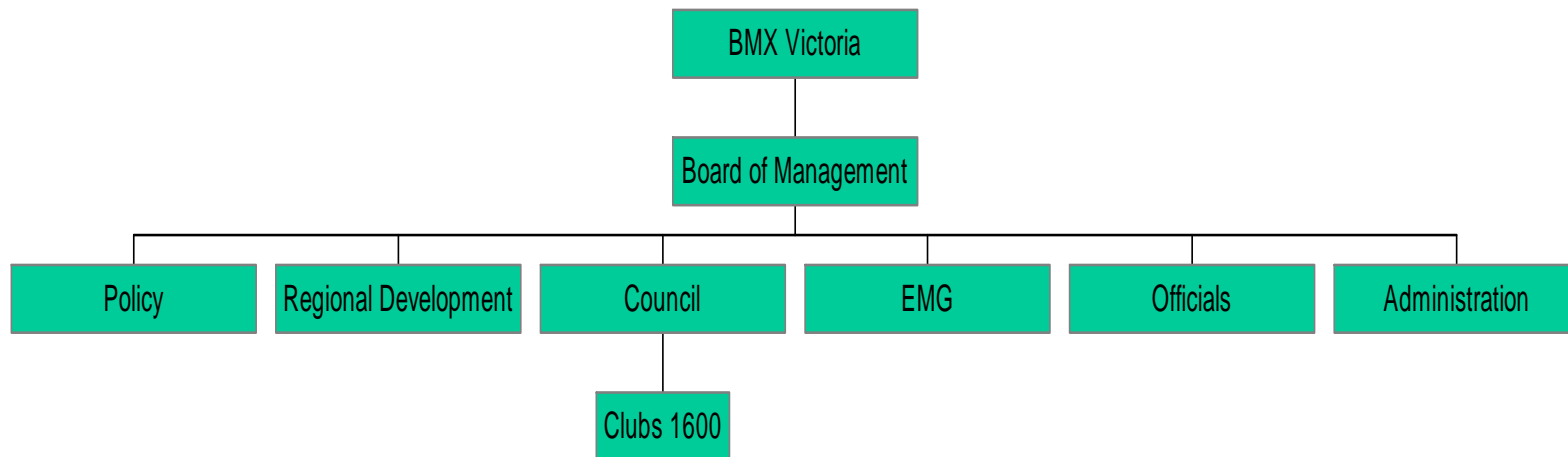

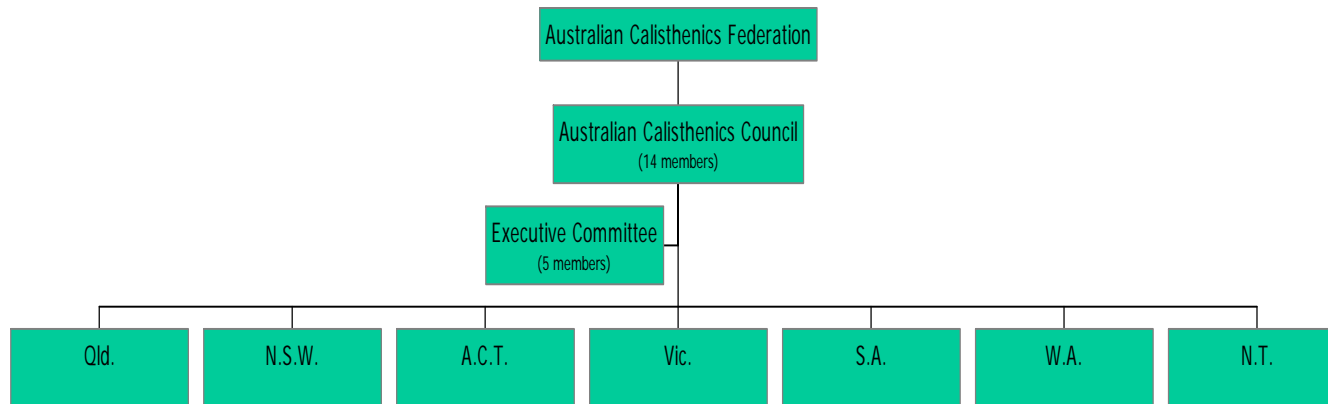

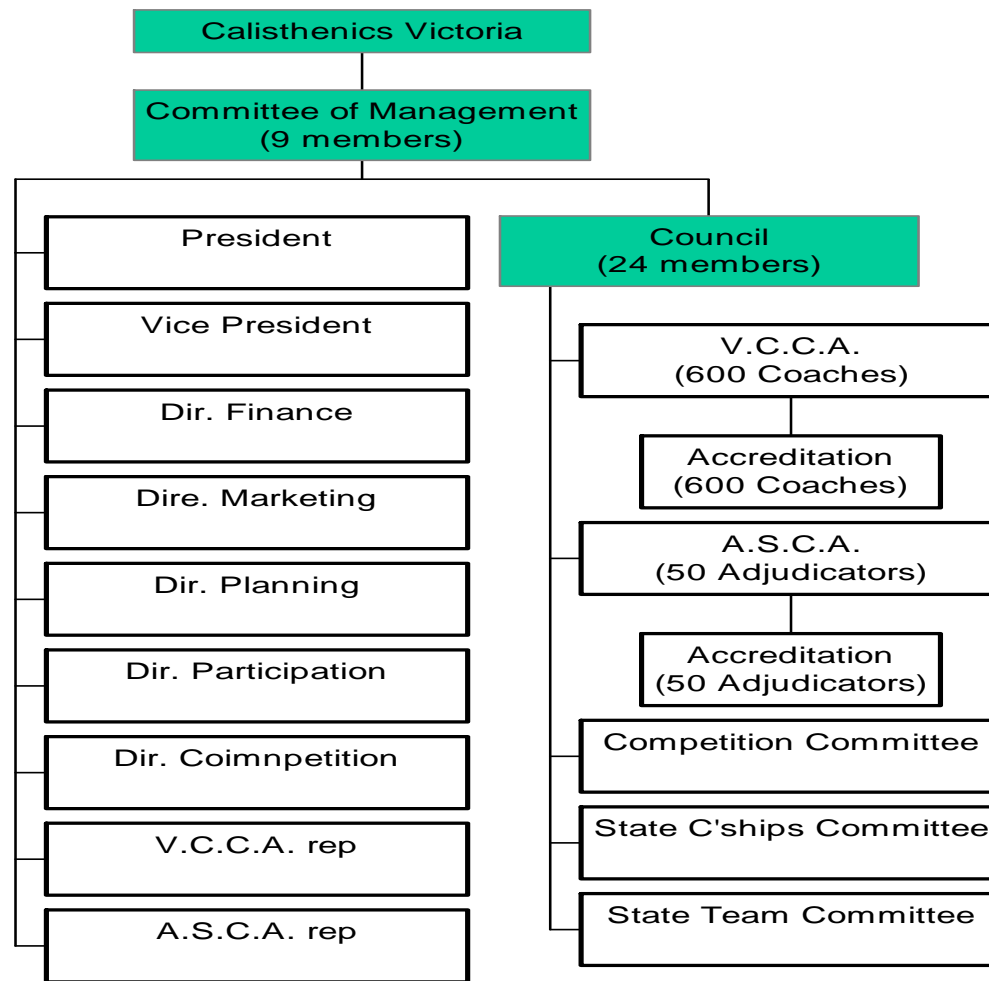

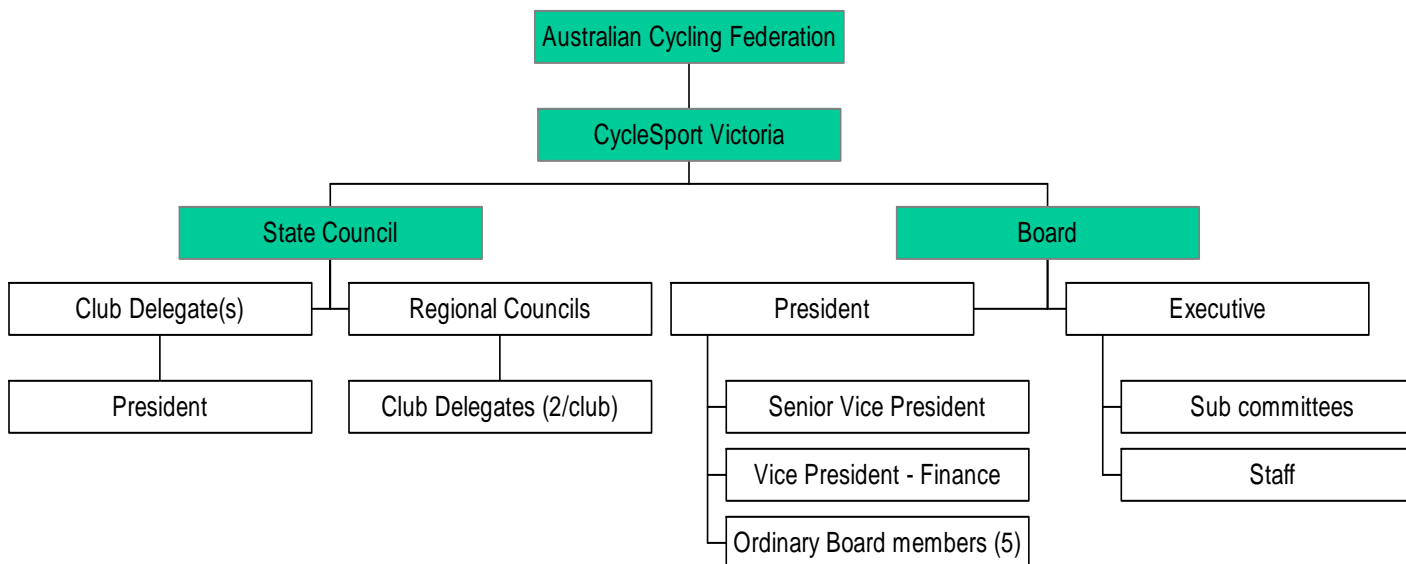

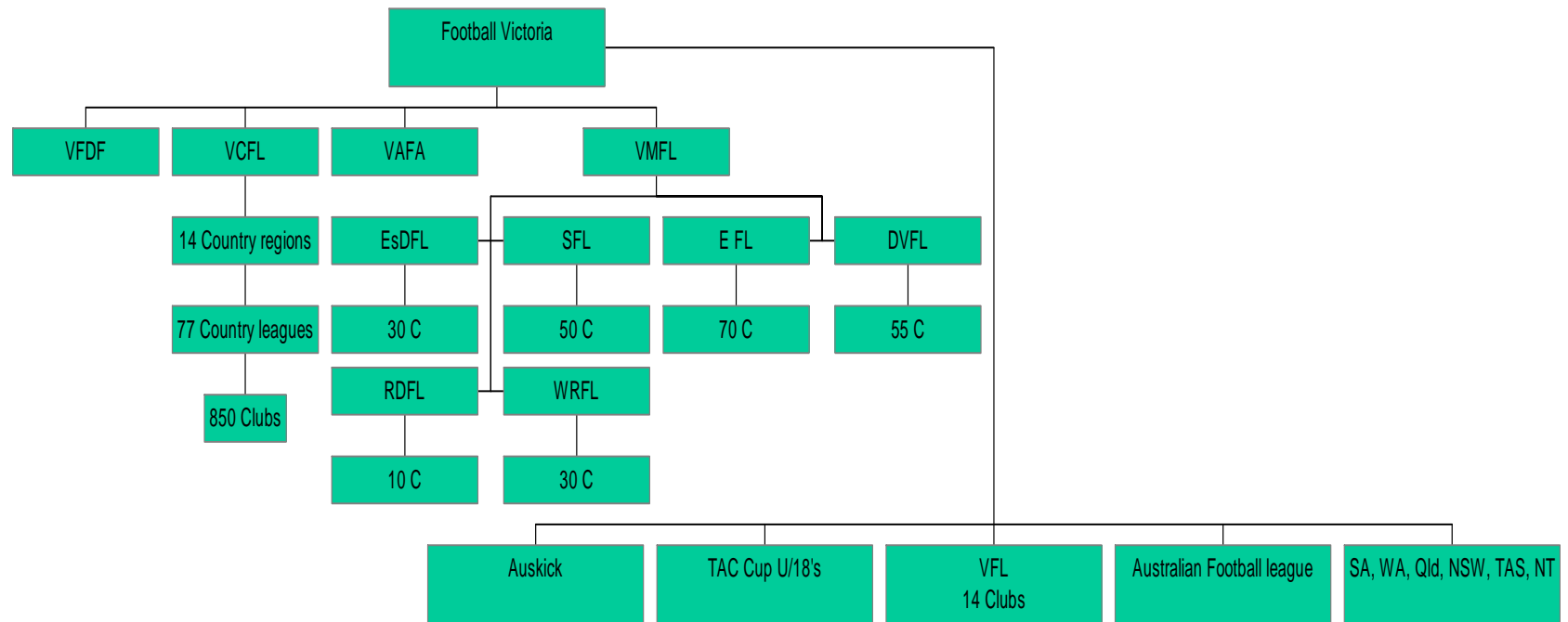

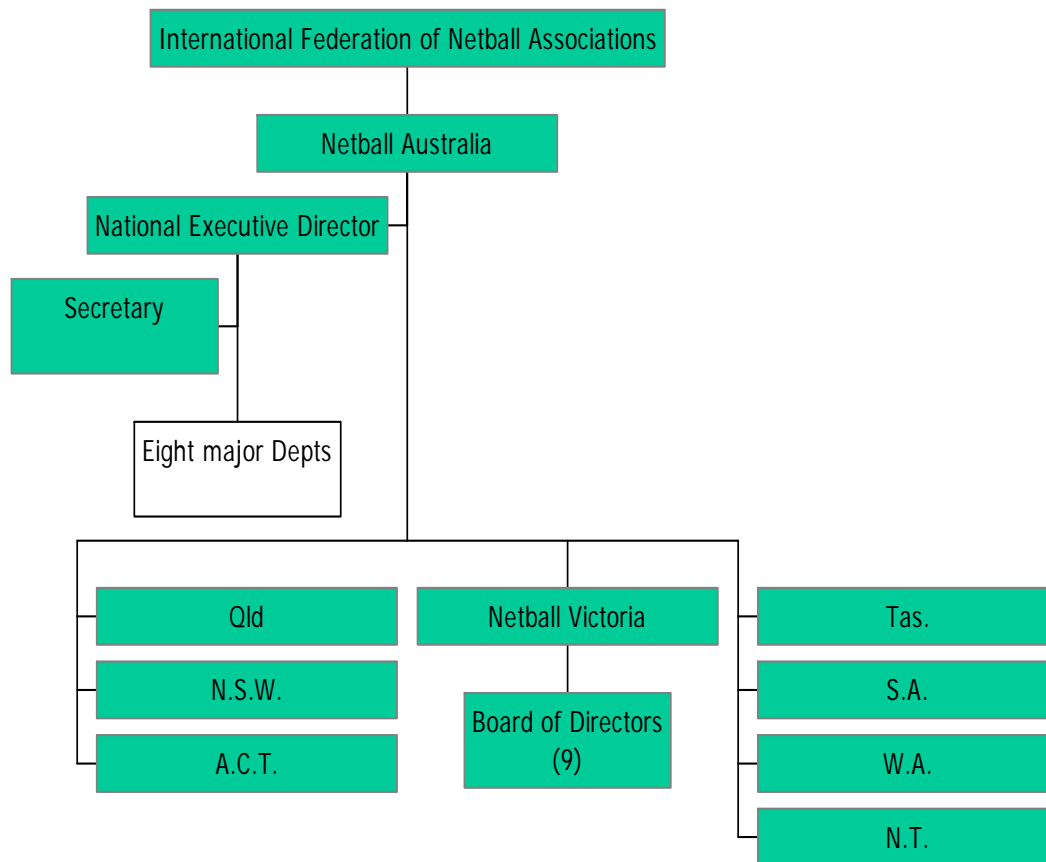

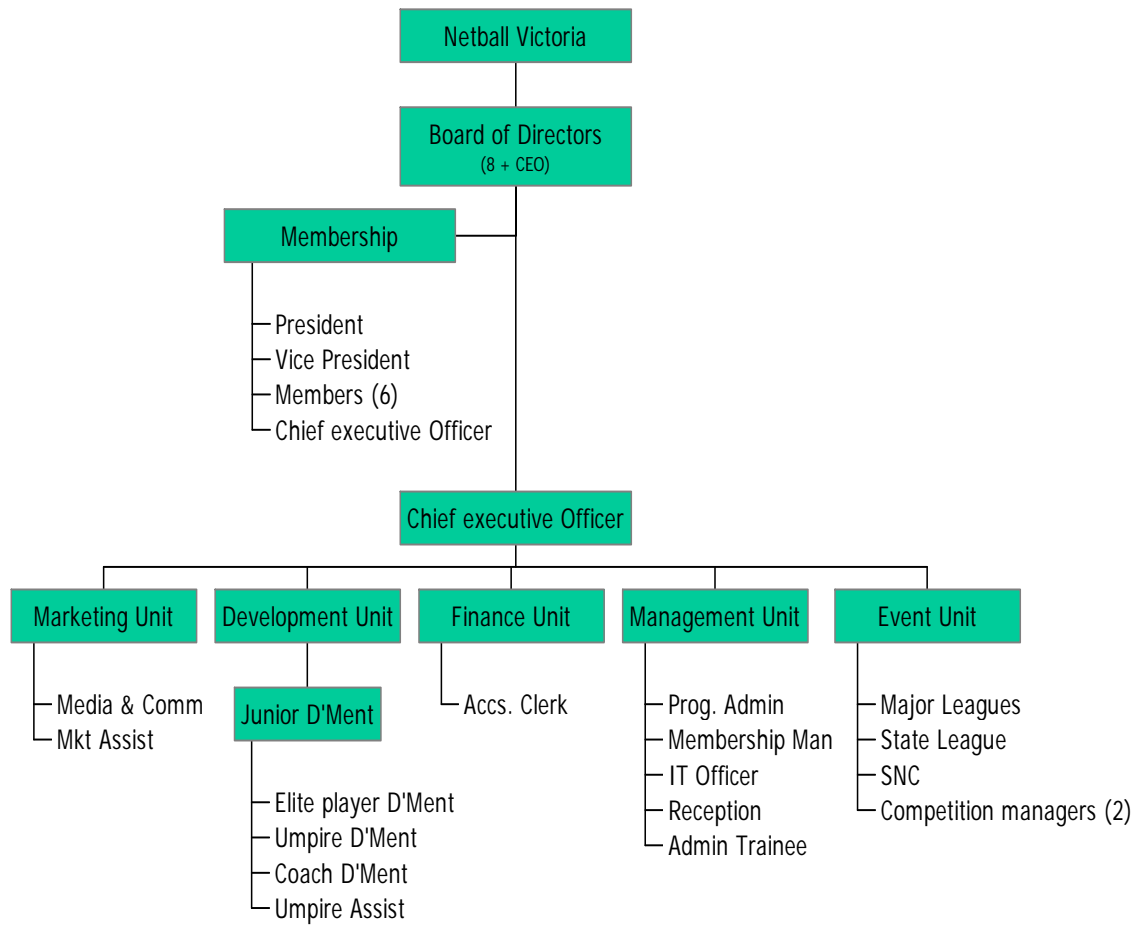

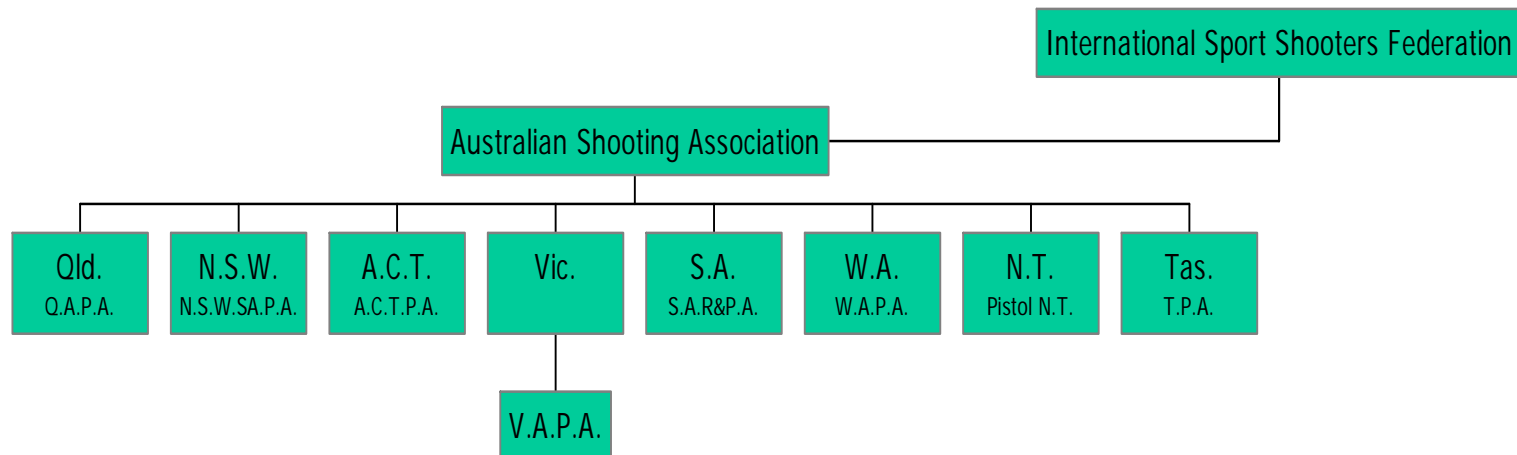

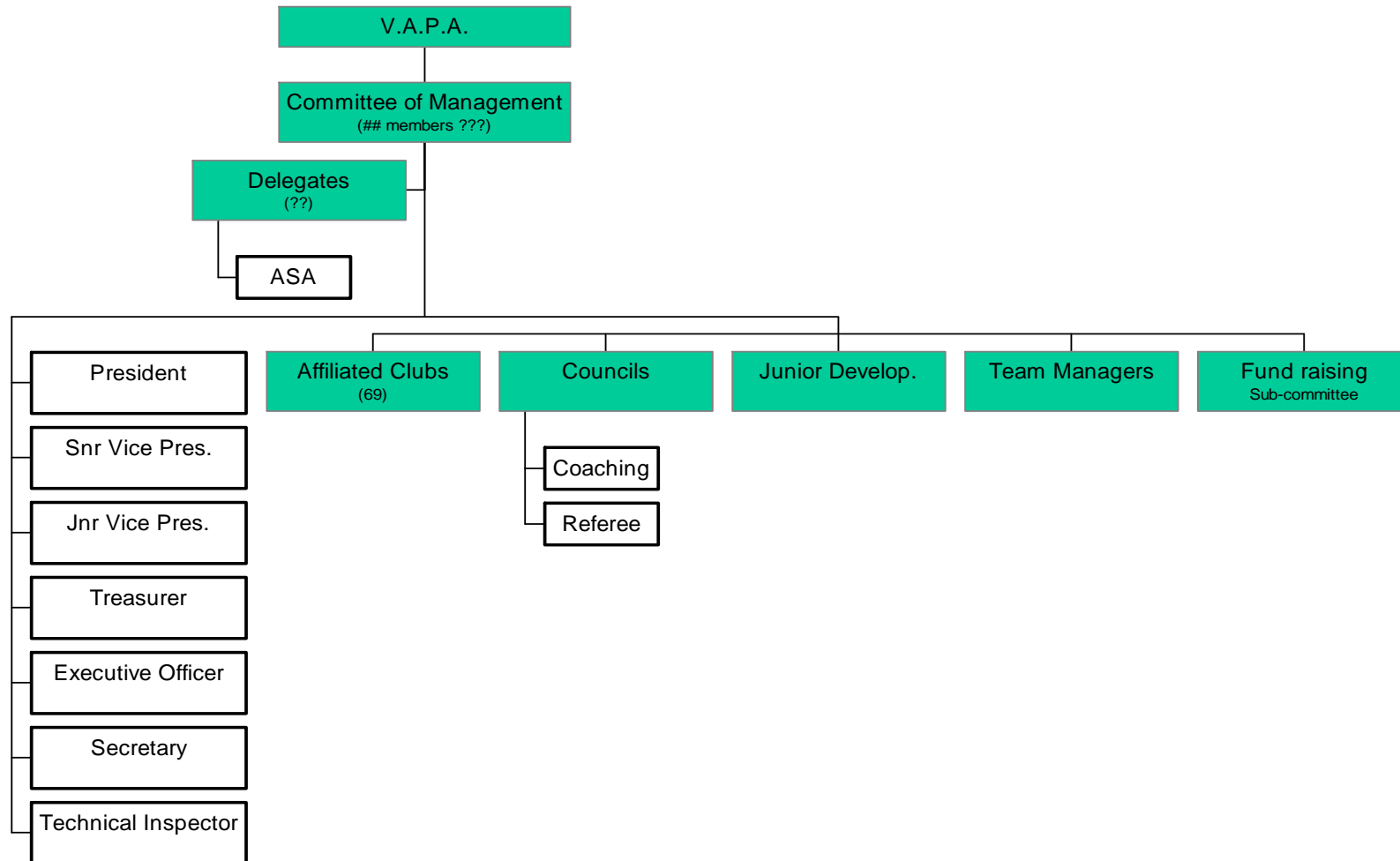

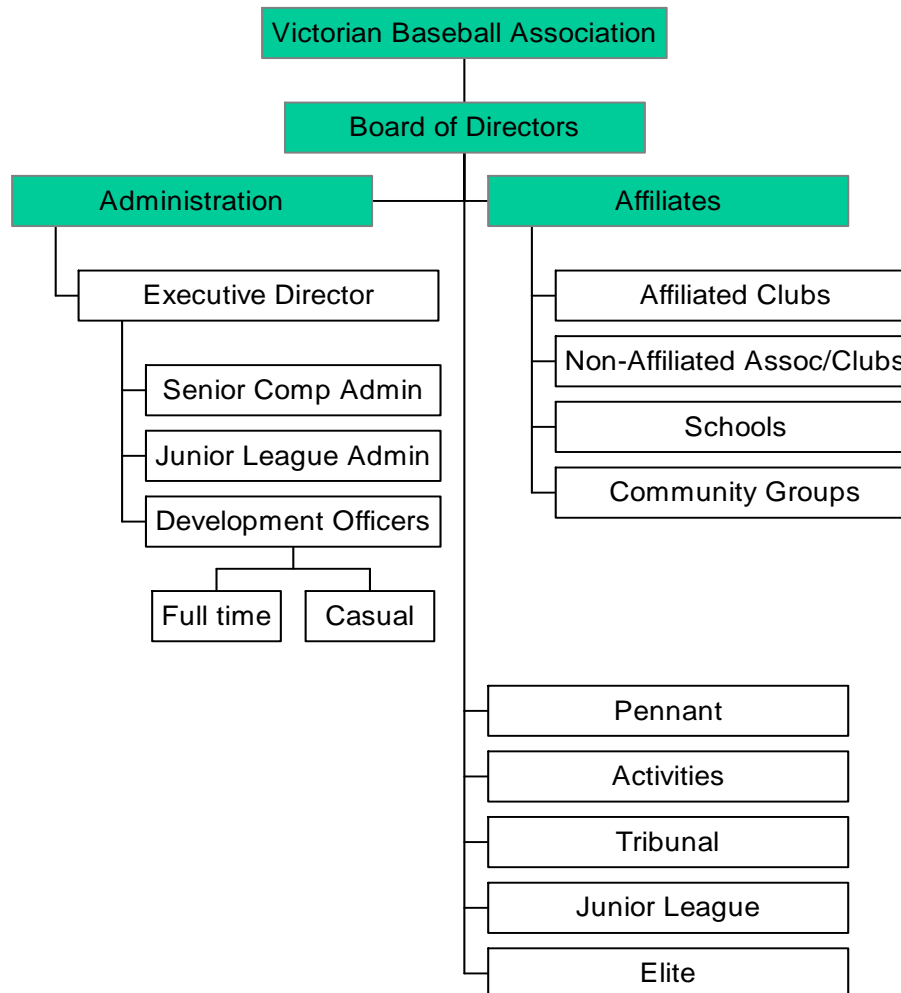

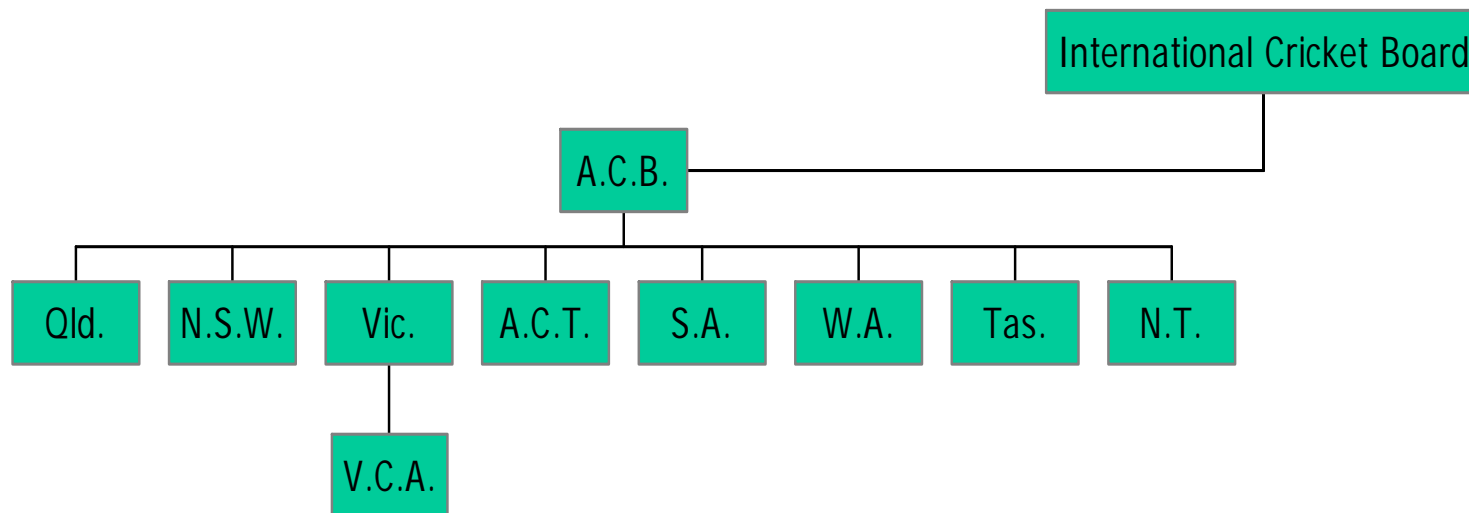

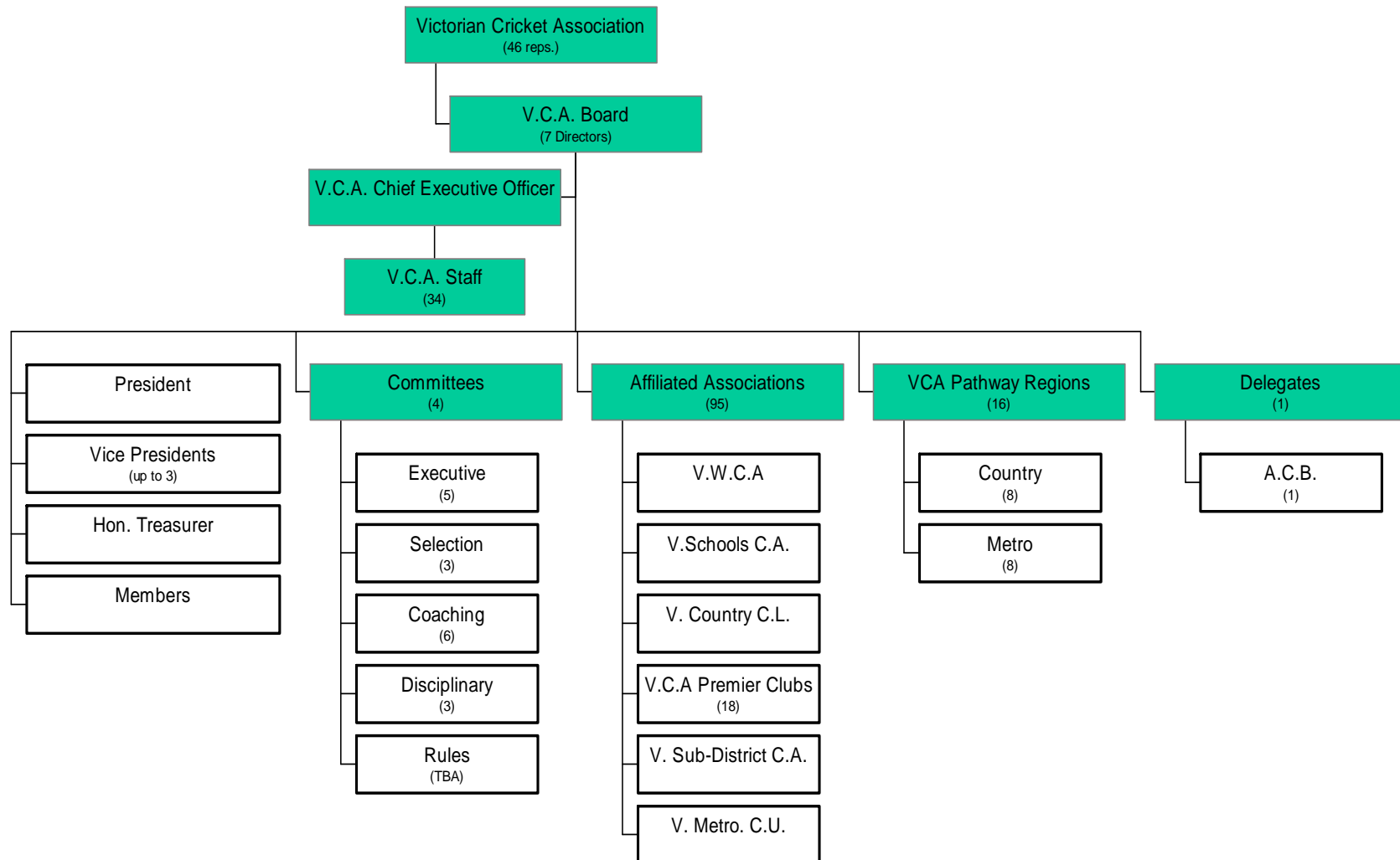

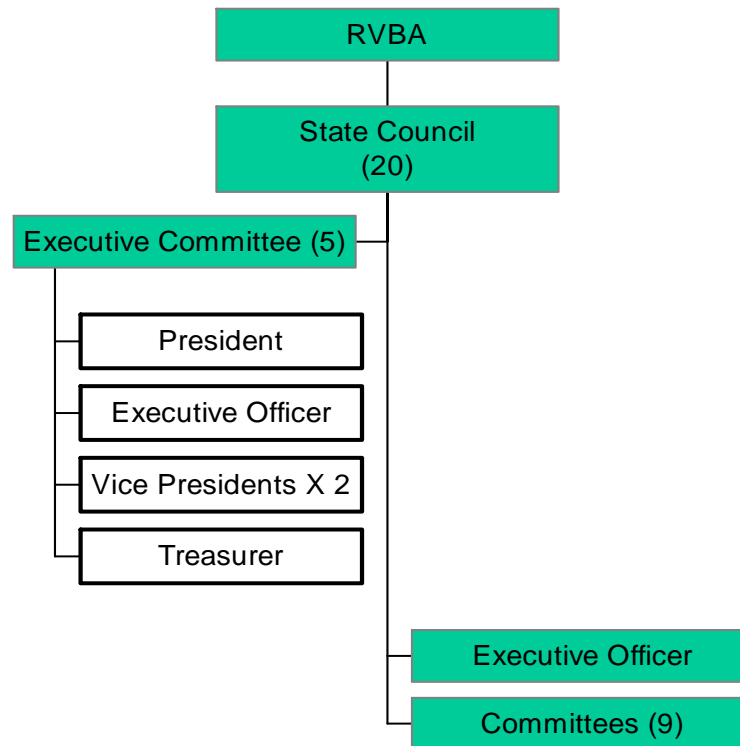

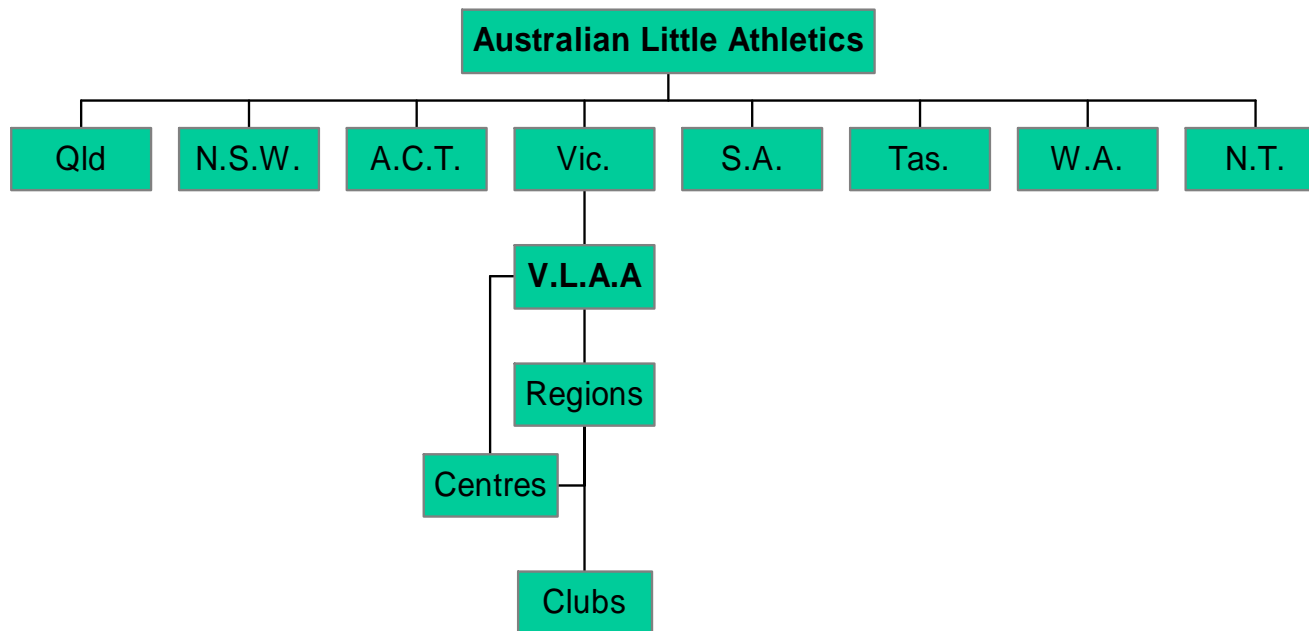

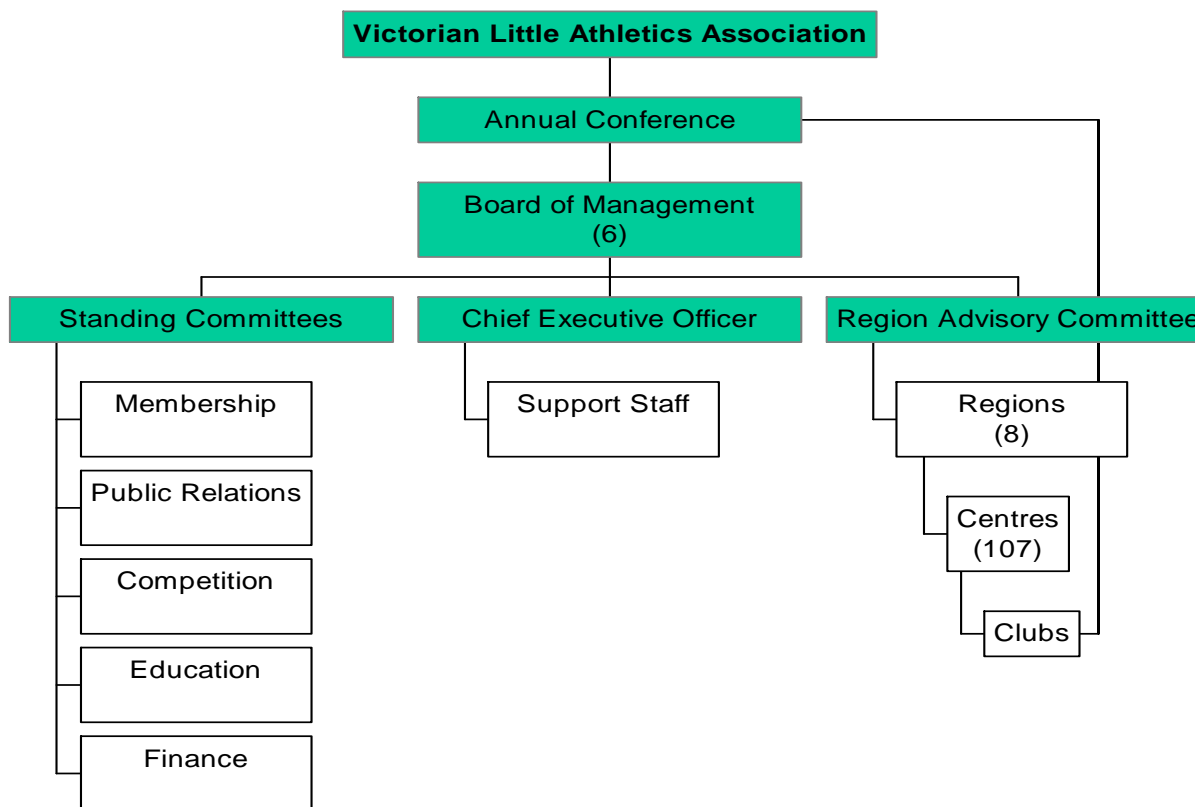

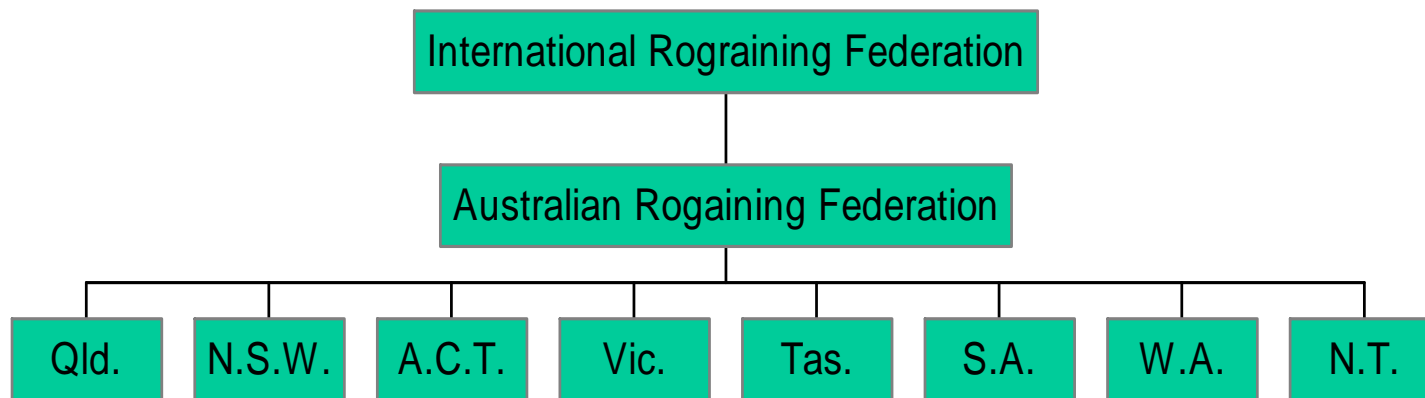

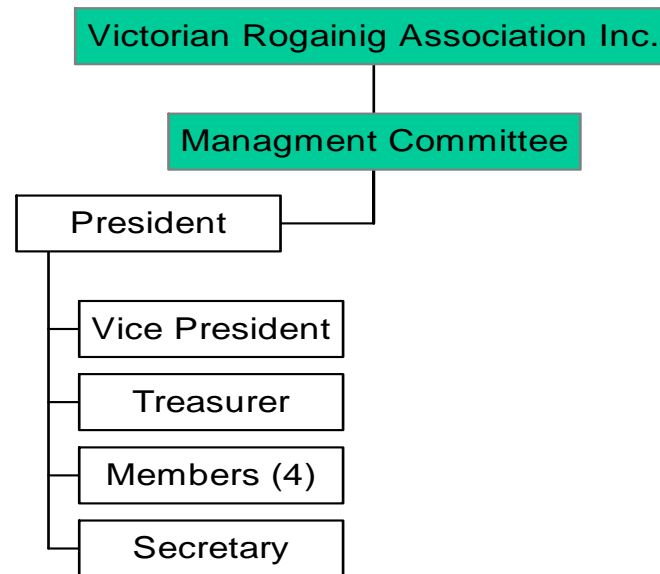

- i) We are purely a volunteer run organisation. We have a very dedicated bunch of individuals around which the organisation runs. Getting enough additional volunteers to run individual events is always a challenge.
- ii) Our shorter events (6 and 8 hour events) are heavily entered with usually 400 to 500 competitors per event. At the other end of the spectrum we may only get 150 to 200 people entered in the classical 24-hour events.
- iii) Communication is via our newsletter which is produced 11 times per year. A volunteer newsletter editor produces the newsletter. The VRA also has a website to keep members and others up-to-date and to publish results.

- iv) We have two Development Officers who have increased the profile of rogaine considerably among scouting groups and schools and have managed to get event results published in the major state newspapers. This has helped introduce a steady stream of new participants to our sport.
- v) There is only one face-to-face meeting between the ARA and the state associations per year. This meeting coincides with the running of the Australian Rogaining Championships. Other correspondence is usually by email.
- vi) We are continually trying to offer members different types of rogaines. We began initially with 24hr bush events and now run bush events of 6, 8, 12 15 and 24 hours. We run a 6 hour Snowgaine, Metrogaine and a Cyclogaine. In 2001 we will be holding a paddlegaine (canoes and kayaks) and a Trigaine (paddle/cycle/6hr rogaine).

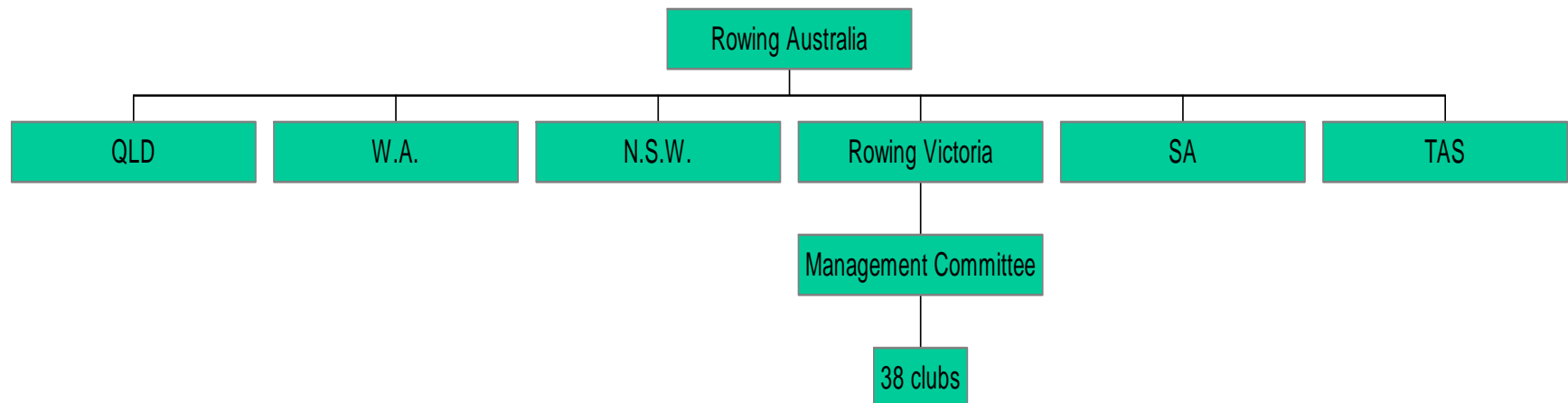

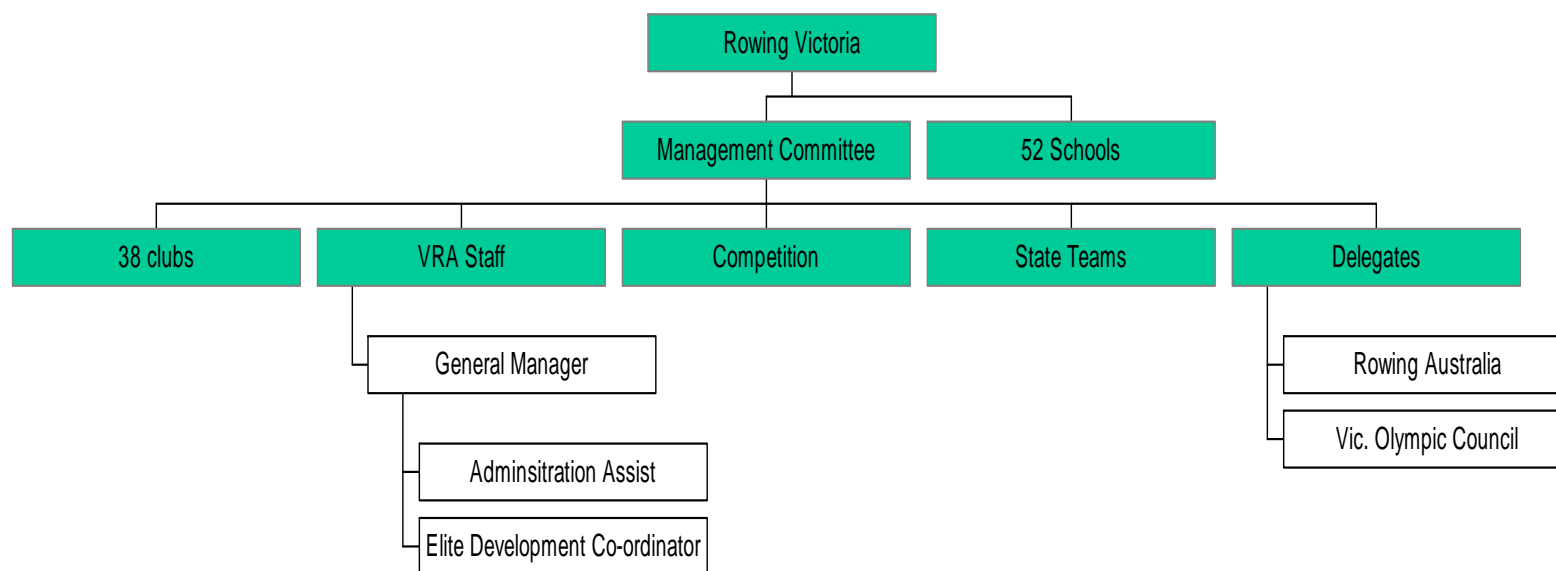
Our management committee generally works well together. We always have a lot to get through at meetings, which we hold monthly. The committee's only self-criticism is that we don't have a committee member under 29, something we are trying to address. Our other main issue is that we are a volunteer run organisation and we all have full time jobs so finding time to get everything done is not easy. Also finding enough volunteers to run our events is a continual challenge although we have never had to cancel a scheduled event due to lack of volunteers.

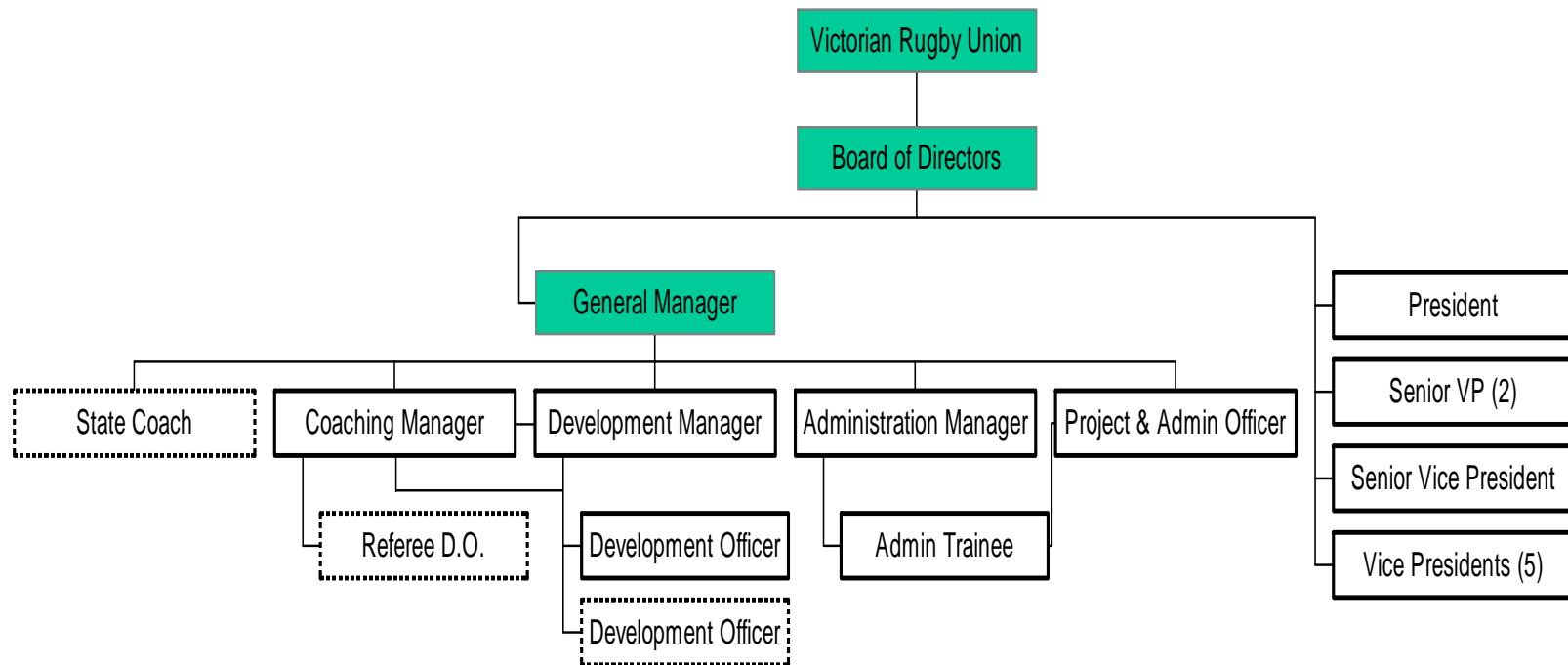

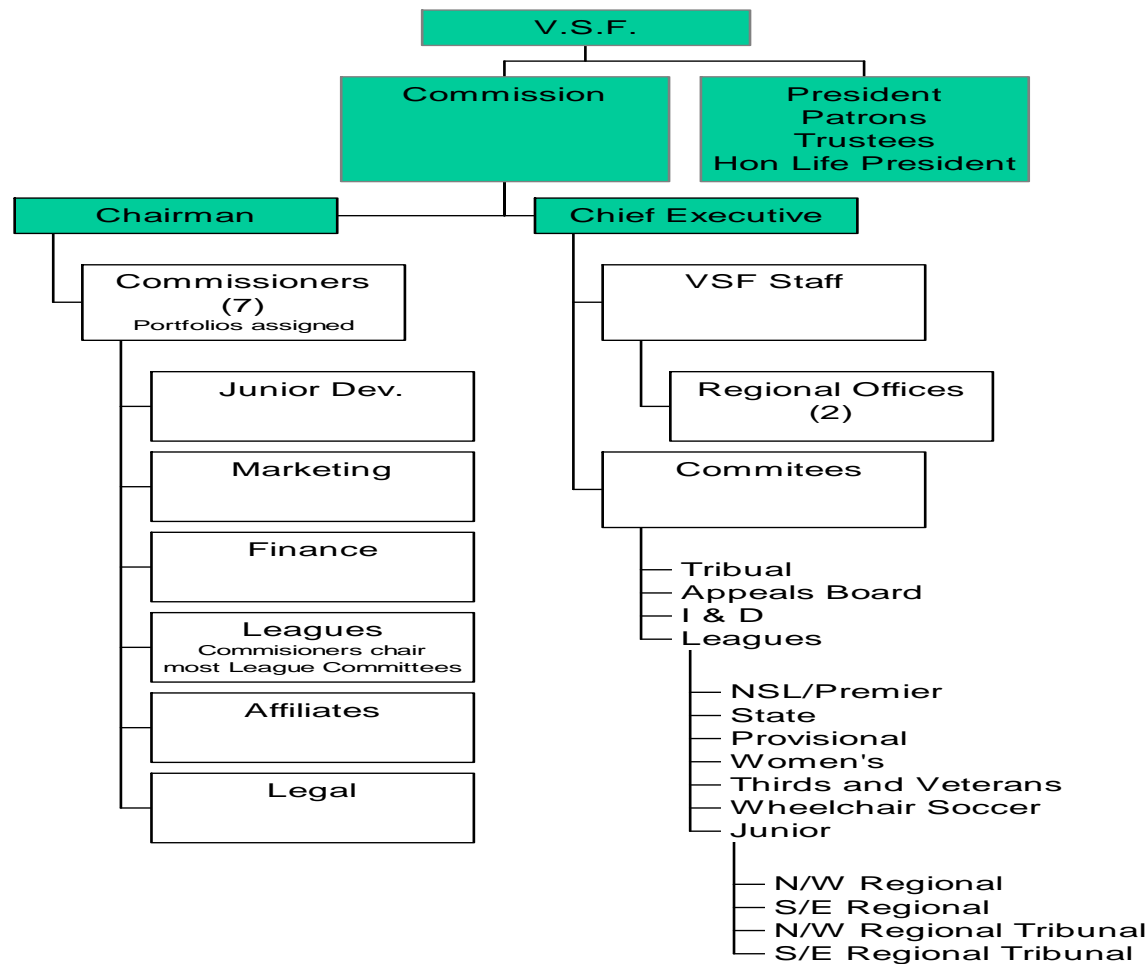

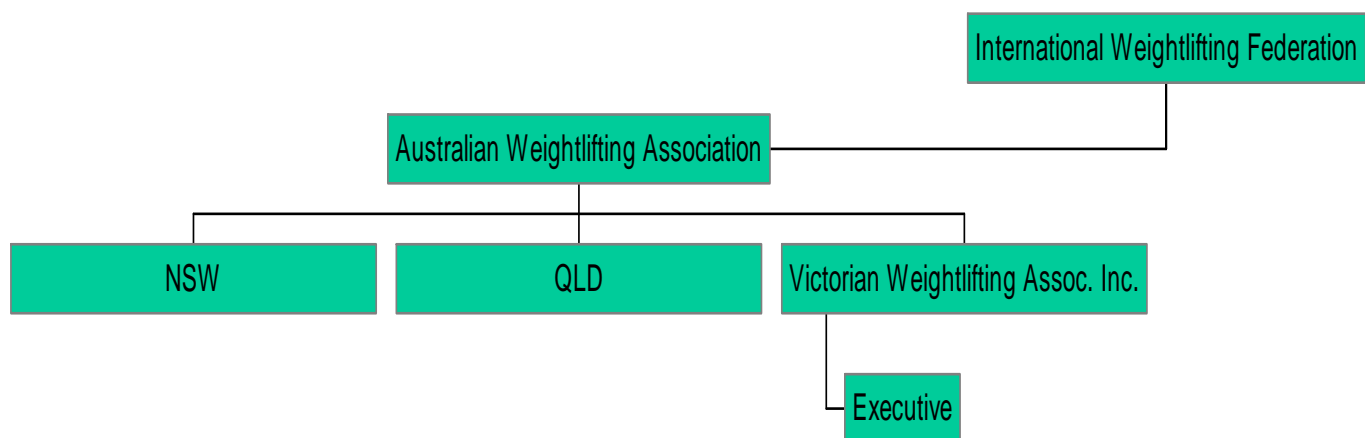
Mapping Structure For Victorian Softball Association

1) National Organisational structure

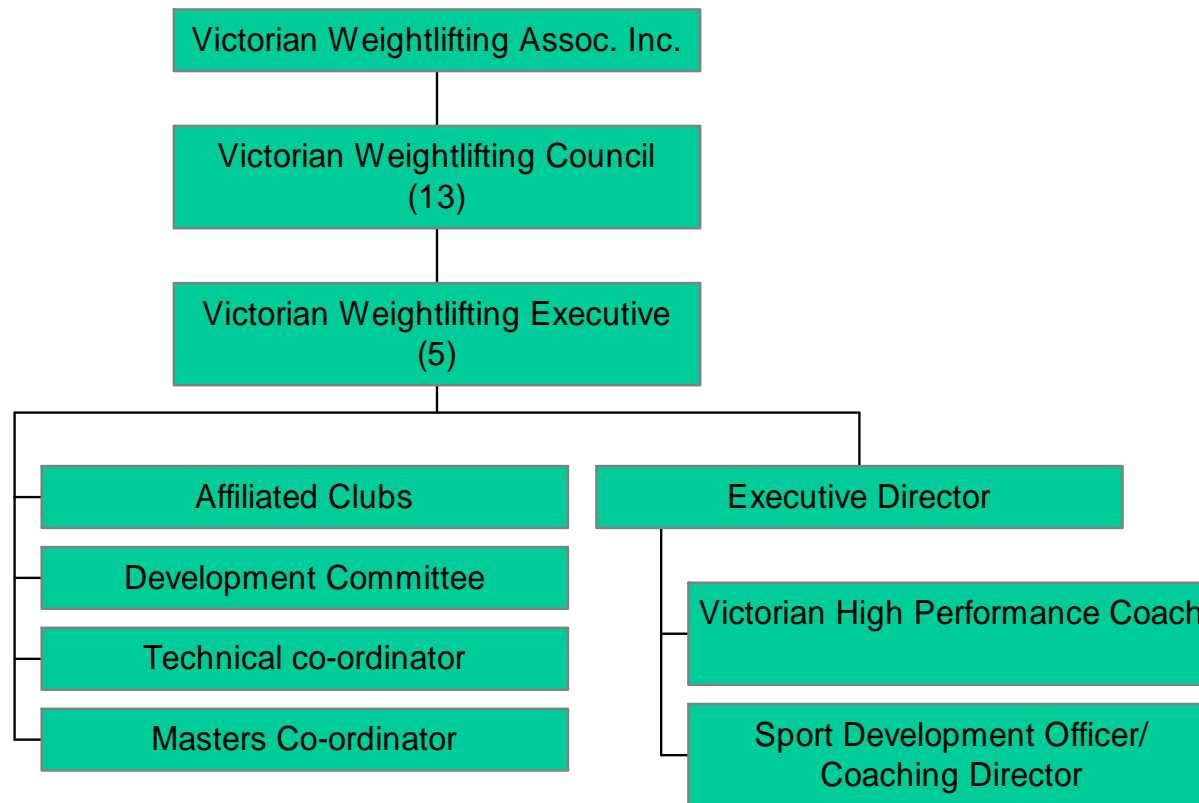


Mapping Structure For Victorian Weightlifting Association

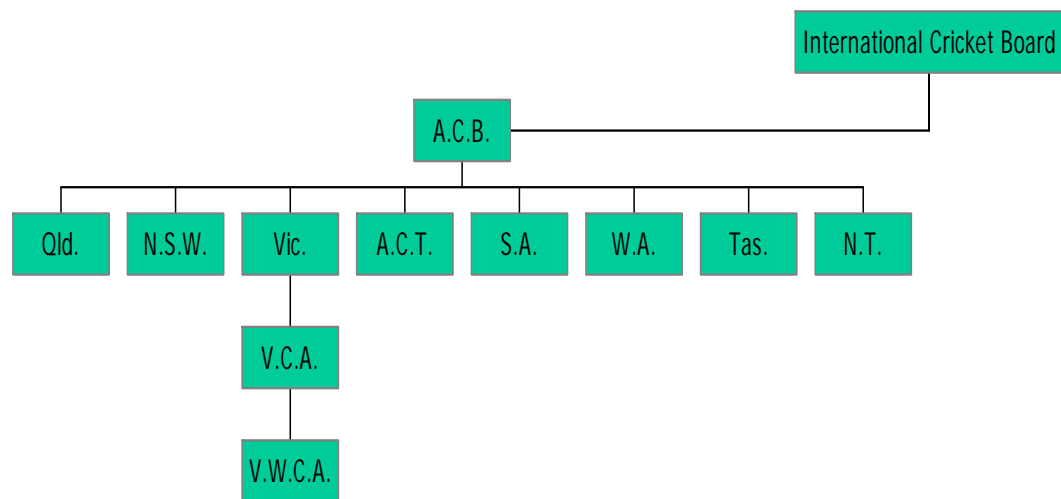

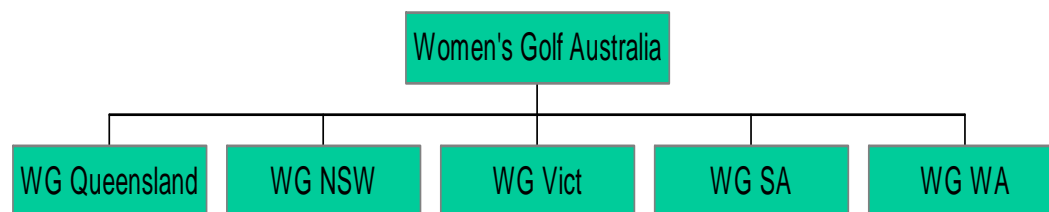

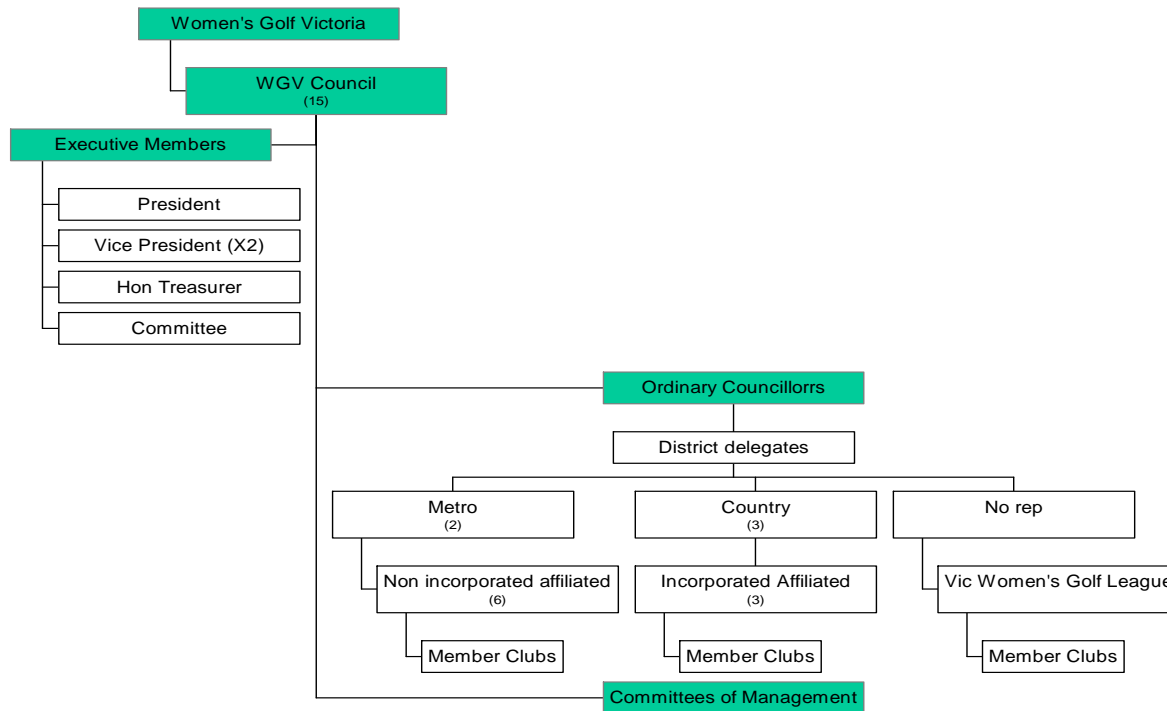
